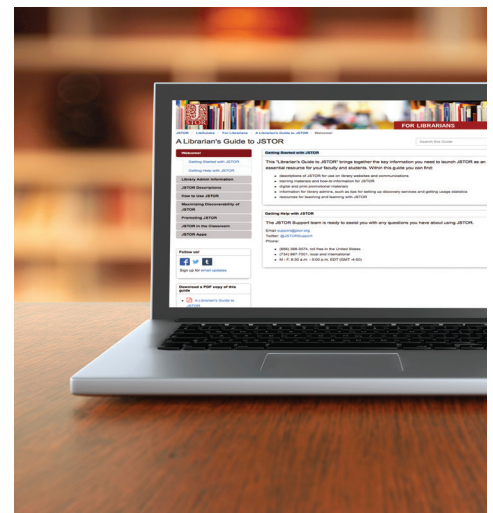
GETTING STARTED WITH RESEARCH ON JSTOR
